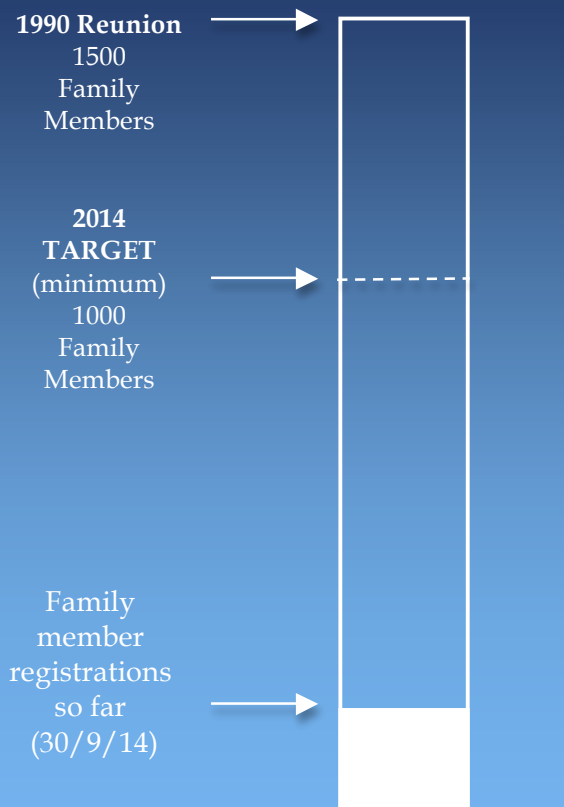
DO US A FAVOUR REGISTER NOW

REST IN PEACE



Doug and Florence Baker

Florence Laurel Baker nee Hawthorne (1928-2014) grew up in Katikati on her family's ballot farm at Apata. Her first job after leaving the farm was at her Uncle Dick and Auntie Ethel's farm at Galatea and it was there she met Doug Baker at the local dance while he was working on a bush block in the area.

They courted and often spent time at Ohiwa Beach and married when she was 21. Between 1951 and 1960 they had their children Peter, Susan and her twin sister Sandra (who unfortunately died at birth), David, Valerie and Lloyd.

They raised their family in Katikati where they owned the mill which is still operating today. They also purchased a farm block on Rea's Road in the 1950's.

Florence was a strong woman who influenced many people over the years and was an astute business person who worked very hard in her early years doing lots of different manual jobs. She loved all of her children, grandchildren, and her husband who she followed and supported through their 57 years of marriage until Doug passed away in June 2006.

Doug and Florence are a reminder of the history within our family and which passes away with them. We want storytelling to be part of our family reunion so look out for your opportunity to tell us about your earliest memories and your memories of your parents, grandparents and great-grandparents.
